

ORDINANCE NO. 169

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A CITY ATTORNEY FOR THE CITY OF GREENLAND, ARKANSAS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY TO EXIST, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated Section 14-42-112 has been interpreted to require Arkansas Cities of the Second Class and Incorporated towns to hold elections for the position of Municipal Attorney;

WHEREAS, the City of Greenland, Arkansas, has, since incorporation as a town, appointed its Municipal Attorneys as required by the needs of the Town/City;

WHEREAS, the Greenland City Council having considered benefits to the City of electing a Municipal Attorney considered the benefits to the City of appointing its Municipal Attorney; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of Greenland, Arkansas, determined that the best interest of the City and its citizens will be most effectively served by the continued appointment of Municipal Attorney.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR CITY OF GREENLAND, ARKANSAS, THAT,

1. The Municipal Attorney for the City of Greenland, Arkansas, shall be appointed by the Mayor and approved by a majority of the City Council for terms of two (2) years which term shall begin January 1 of each odd numbered year and end on December 31 of the following even numbered year.

2. That nothing herein shall prevent the aforesaid City Council, by majority vote, from terminating a Municipal Attorney,

at will, with or without cause, furthermore, nothing herein shall prevent a duly appointed and acting Municipal Attorney from resigning such position at will, and in either event no prior notice shall be required.

3. That the Municipal Attorney shall be responsible representing the City of Greenland in all actions civil and criminal, to attend all meetings of the City Council, to give (when called upon) advice in matters of law to the Mayor and City Council, to write ordinances referred to him by the City Council, to write or pass upon the legal form and validity of all contracts (when called upon to do so), and providing general legal services to the City as may be required by local Ordinance or State law.

4. That the salary of the Municipal Attorney in respective positions of City Attorney and Prosecuting Attorney shall be set by the City Council from time to time

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF GREENLAND, THAT an emergency exists, immediate passage implementation of this Ordinance is necessary for the efficient administration of City business and to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Greenland, Arkansas, and therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
